Carol called the meeting to order at 7:02pm

- Carol passed around March's minutes for approval. The minutes were motioned by Linda and seconded by Darlene, and were approved unanimously.

#### Reports/Updates

- Irene stated that there are currently 31 events in our cluster!
  - Duvall Days, May 31<sup>st</sup>, which Kiersten is coordinating, with participation with Paula and Irene as well. The parade entry form is complete, with a \$5 fee to include the KCLS van. We want to put up a table with crafts and a tour of the van. Rather than paying for a spot with the Duvall Days vendors, why don't we just use our own parking lot? DFOL will participate in the parade, but not the booth.
  - Sisters in Time (April 7<sup>th</sup>) resulted in 25 attendees. Karen Haas was the event leader, where she portrayed 4 different women in history. It was 90 minutes of nonstop storytelling. This was in partnership with the Duvall Historical Society. Another event is planned for September 27<sup>th</sup>, during the Heritage Festival.
  - Last year the library had a booth at Carnation's TimberFest. There will NOT be a booth this year, but there will still be a presentation in the barn with crafts.
  - Irene suggested participation at SummerStage – possibly bring a craft table and booth. She will talk to Cass Haldeman at the City of Duvall.
- Alan stated that Duvall's Library Board is working on the mission now that the library is built. The new officers and members on the board have lots of excitement, and want to increase their participation with DFOL.
- Carol provided a financial report. She stated that the website is in progress; \$150 has been paid for a 25% deposit. \$200 was paid out in March for teen programming this summer. \$300 was paid to Karen Haas for the Sisters in Time program. We currently have \$19,556 in cash accounts.

#### New Business

- Raffle Barrel:
  - We discussed a theme for the Raffle Barrel (May 10<sup>th</sup> Civic Club's annual plant/garden sale) – we agreed on frogs.
  - We need volunteers to man the booth from 10-4, volunteers to gather donations for the raffle, volunteers to take fliers around to businesses.
  - Donations need to be received by April 30<sup>th</sup>, and brought to the library for assembly on May 9<sup>th</sup>. Everything needs to be picked up from the library before 6pm on the 9<sup>th</sup>, then brought to the Plant Sale location the morning of the 10<sup>th</sup>.
  - Linda will make a timeline.
- Give Big – scheduled for May 6<sup>th</sup>
  - Carol is preparing the donation request letter, and will get sent out to members
- Michele has spoken (via Duvall Community Facebook) with Jon Keehner, an author with local (Duvall) ties. He would like to schedule a book signing at the library. Are we interested? Irene definitely would like that to occur. Michele will forward Irene's contact information to Jon to coordinate the date (likely a Saturday afternoon around 1pm, and likely in September, since many people are gone over the summer). We could put an article in the Woodinville Weekly and the Seattle Times. Michele mentioned that Jon is willing to handle publicity.
